What is check-in and check-out time?

The check-in time at Gaylord Rockies Resort & Convention Center is 4:00 pm and the check-out time is 11:00 am.

How do I get to the Gaylord Rockies from the airport?

The nearest airport is Denver International Airport (DEN), which is 8.5 miles away. While AACTE does not endorse third-party vendors, arrangements can be made with shuttles, taxis, or app-based ride shares to provide you with transportation to and from the airport.

The [light rail](#) is also an option from the airport. The closest light rail stop is 61st and Pena. The hotel shuttle picks up at 61st and Pena at the top and bottom of the hour and picks up from the front drive on the :20 and :50. The first pickup is from the light rail station at 5:30 am and from the resort at 5:50 am. The last pickup from the light rail station is at 11:00 pm, and the last pickup from the front drive is at 11:20 pm.

What are the parking options at Gaylord Rockies Resort & Convention Center?

How do I get to downtown Denver from the Gaylord Rockies?

The [light rail](#) is an easy way to get to downtown Denver from the Gaylord Rockies. There are eight stations, with 61st and Pena being the second stop after leaving the airport. The 23-mile ride takes approximately 37 minutes at a cost of \$10 daily.

What is the cancellation policy for the AACTE Annual Meeting?

All cancellation and refund requests must be submitted in writing no later than the final registration deadline of the event in questions to receive a refund. Cancellation requests received after the registration deadline will not be eligible for a refund, unless documentation is presented to prove the individual registrant was unable to travel. A \$150 administrative fee will be deducted for each cancellation request for full price events and deducted from the refund. A \$50 administrative fee will be deducted for each cancellation request for student price events and deducted from the refund. All refunds are processed after the event date.
