His research has directly informed national treatment guidelines and expanded treatment options nationwide.

Throughout his career, Dr. Sheehan has been widely admired for his profound compassion, intellectual humility, and steadfast commitment to patient-centered care. He blends scientific precision with a warm, humanistic approach that treats every patient as deserving of dignity and hope.
