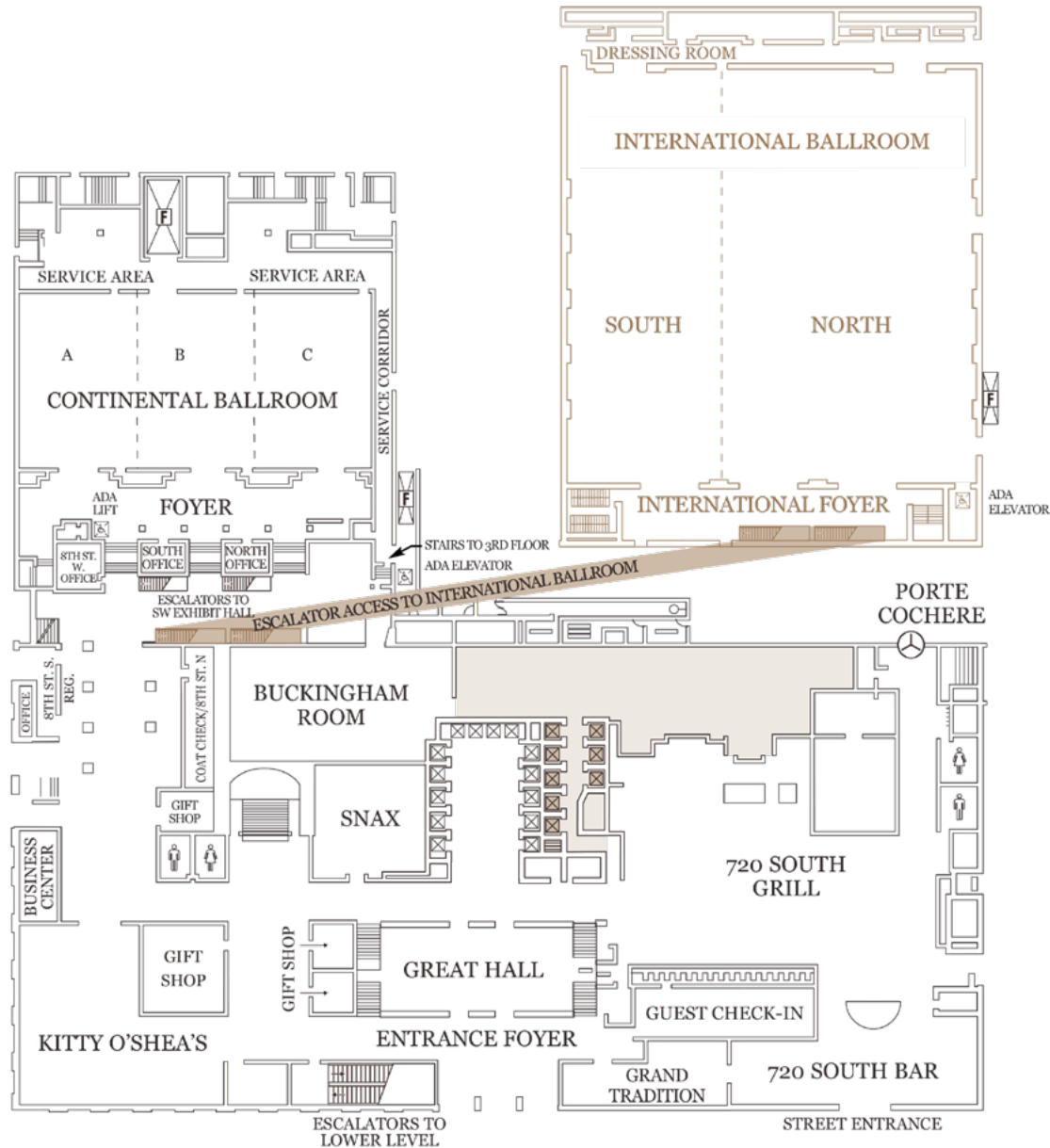


Hilton Chicago Maps

Lower Level (Stevens Meeting Center)

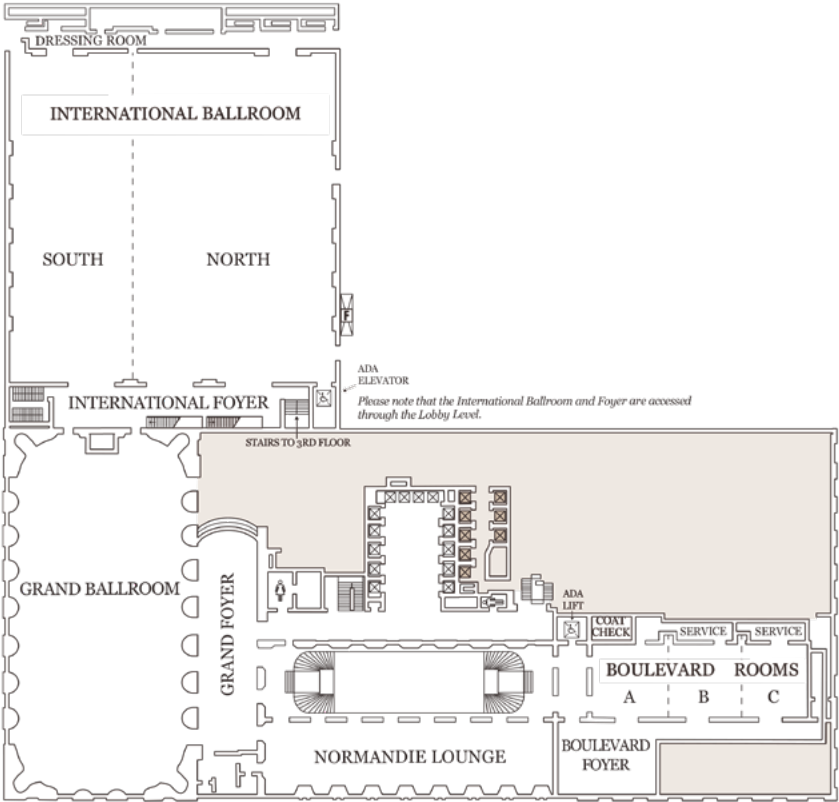
