INTERPROFESSIONAL CONTINUING EDUCATION

In support of improving patient care, the Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists is jointly accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), and the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) to provide continuing education for the healthcare team.



IPCE CREDIT™

This activity was planned by and for the healthcare team, and learners will receive up to 31.25 Interprofessional Continuing Education (IPCE) credit for learning and change.

Registered Dietitians



Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR): CDR Credentialed Practitioners can receive up to 31.25 Continuing Professional Education units (CPEUs) for completion of this activity. Completion of this RD/DTR profession-specific or IPCE activity awards CPEUs (One IPCE credit = One CPEU). If the activity is dietetics-related but not targeted to RDs or DTRs, CPEUs may be claimed which are commensurate with participation in contact hours (One 60 minute hour = 1 CPEU. RDs and DTRs are to select activity type 102 in their Activity Log. Sphere and Competency selection is at the learner's discretion.

Registered Nurses

American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC): The Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists designates this activity for a maximum of 31.25 ANCC contact hours. This activity discusses 3.75 contact hours of pharmacotherapeutic content.

The Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists is approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing, Provider Number 10977, for up to 31.25 contact hours.

Nurse Practitioners

Per the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners Certification Board, nurse practitioners attending ADCES24 are eligible to claim contact hours from ANCC or CME from AAPA. Pharmacotherapeutic hours are listed under the ANCC accreditation statement above and on your continuing education statement of credit upon completion of your session evaluations.

PAs



The Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists authorized by the American Academy of PAs (AAPA) to award AAPA Category 1 CME credit for activities planned in accordance with AAPA CME Criteria. This enduring activity is designated for up to 31.25 AAPA Category 1 CME credits. PAs should only claim credit commensurate with the extent of their participation.

Pharmacists

The Universal Activity Number for each session will be provided to learners on their transcript upon completion of an evaluation. ADCES24 has been approved for up to 31.25 contact hour(s).

Physicians

American Medical Association (AMA): The Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists designates this live and enduring activity for a maximum of 31.25 AMA PRA Category 1 Credit(s)TM. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

Social Workers



As a Jointly Accredited Organization, the Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists is approved to offer social work continuing education by the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) Approved Continuing Education (ACE) program. Organizations, not individual courses, are approved under this program. State and provincial regulatory boards have the final authority to determine whether an individual course may be accepted for continuing education credit. The Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists maintains responsibility for this course. Social workers completing this course receive up to 2.0 continuing education credits.

Per ASWB's Approved Continuing Education Program (ACE), sessions that are less than 60 minutes each are not eligible for ACE credit. The 3.0 continuing education credits listed reflects the (3) 60-minute/ On-Demand sessions available at ADCES24.

MCHES and CHES Credentialed Attendees

Application for CHES® (entry/level) / MCHES® (advanced level) Category I continuing education contact hours (CECH) has been made to the National Commission for Health Education Credentialing, Inc. (NCHEC)."

Board Certified-Advanced Diabetes Management (BC-ADM)

ADCES is the administering body for the Advanced Diabetes Management credentials. Continuing education programs offered by ADCES can be used toward fulfilling BC-ADM certification and recertification requirements.

Certified Diabetes Care and Education Specialists

To satisfy the requirements for renewal of certification for the Certification Board for Diabetes Care and Education (CBDCE), continuing education activities must be diabetes related and approved by a provider on the CBDCE list of approved providers (www.ncbde.org). CBDCE does not approve continuing education. The Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists (ADCES) is on the CBDCE list of approved providers.
