ABPM Exam Information

ABPM Eligibility for ABMS Addiction Medicine Subspecialty

Beginning October 2017 through October 2025, physicians who have a primary American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) board (including current addiction medicine specialists with a primary ABMS board certification) may apply to take the ABPM exam to become an addiction medicine specialist. The Practice Pathway was recently extended to 2025, after which time a one-year, ACGME-accredited fellowship will be required to become an addiction medicine specialist.

Physicians interested in taking the exam to become certified in addiction medicine need to complete the application on the ABPM website. The application period for the exam is March 15 through June 30, 2021. Applicants will be notified of approval electronically by ABPM.

A variety of exam dates and locations will be offered from October 11 through October 31, 2021. Approved applicants will have the opportunity to select their exam location and date upon approval notification.




