# HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO REGISTER FOR HILL DAY AT HOME?

Registration for Hill Day at Home is free. However, attendees are responsible for their travel to and accommodations in Washington, D.C.

# I TRIED TO REGISTER AND WAS PUT ON A WAITLIST, WHAT COMES NEXT?

While we will work to accommodate everyone interested in attending Hill Day 2024, space is limited. If you are prompted to join a wait list, the National Council will be in touch regarding next steps. As space becomes available, you will be notified.

### WHO SCHEDULES MY MEETINGS WITH ELECTED OFFICIALS?

Upon successfully registering, meetings will be scheduled on your behalf. You'll be provided a tentative Hill Day meeting schedule a week prior to the event, with a confirmed meeting schedule provided at the start of Hill Day.
