

Serving as an Oral Presenter for a CME-accredited Activity

This document provides a set of guidelines for individuals serving as faculty at a Society for Neuro-Oncology (SNO) educational activity.

- Disclosure of Relevant Financial Relationships: All individuals in a position to control content of a CME activity *must* provide disclosure information for any financial relationships an individual may have with an ACCME-defined commercial interest, in any amount, within the last 24 months. Failure to provide disclosure information *before* your participation in the activity will lead to recusal from the activity.
- **CME Presentation Development:** Content for the CME-accredited activity *must* be submitted, by no later than, or before, the communicated deadline. Content submitted beyond this deadline may be removed from the program.
 - o Adherence to the CME Clinical Content Validation Statements, which state:
 - All the recommendations involving clinical medicine within your presentation must be based on evidence that is accepted within the profession of medicine as adequate justification for their indications and contraindications in the care of patients, as may be applicable.
 - All scientific research referred to, reported or used in your presentation in support or
 justification of a patient care recommendation must conform to the generally accepted
 standards of experimental design, data collection and analysis.
 - Use of Commercial Logos: The use of commercial interest logos is *prohibited* within a CME presentation.
 - The Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education defines a commercial interest as "any entity producing, marketing, re-selling, or distributing health care goods or services consumed by, or used on, patients." The ACCME does not consider providers of clinical service directly to patients to be commercial interests.
 - Drug Names: SNO requires the use of generic drug names be used in CME presentations.
 Presentations must give a balanced view of therapeutic options and use of generic names contributes to this balance and impartiality.
 - Unlabeled/Unapproved Drug/Device Disclosure: Provide disclosure of unlabeled or unapproved uses of drugs or devices to which you may refer in your presentation, as may be applicable.
 - References/Citations: CME must be based on the best available evidence. Please include references where applicable or include a reference slide at the end of the presentation. Citations should be included for direct quotes, facts, paraphrasing or using key words or phrases, summarizing data, using another author's ideas or mentioning another author's name.
 - Disclosure Slide: Please include a disclosure statement in an opening slide that precedes your presentation, stating whether you hold a financial relationship(s), or not, with an ACCME defined commercial interest. This slide *must* align with the disclosure form submitted to SNO (see above, item 1). If you have nothing to disclose the slide may simply state "I have nothing to disclose."
